**Part 2: Essay Questions** 

New Junior Counselor applicants—please answer the questions in Sections A and B only! Returning Junior Counselor applicants—please answer the questions in Section C only! When we review and begin selecting the Junior Counselors for the summer we look carefully at your answers to each of the questions as they help us to measure your level of maturity, your commitment to teaching, and your capacity to be a caregiver to the campers at Eagle's Nest. Please use a separate sheet of paper to answer the sections of questions that apply to you. Please put serious thought into your answers. We want to know what you truly think and believe.

#### Section A: (for applicants who have not served as Junior Counselors)

- 1. Why do you want to be a Junior Counselor? Why do you think you would make a good JC?
- 2. What challenges do you expect to face as a JC? What things really stress you out?
- 3. What experience do you have working with and/or teaching children, and serving in leadership positions?
- 4. Tell us a little about the type of care and attention that you will need to provide to the campers in the cabin age group with which you'd like to work.
- 5. Are you aware of Eagle's Nest's zero tolerance policy regarding drugs, alcohol and tobacco products? Why do you think it's important that counselors and JCs are expected to uphold this policy? What would you do if you found out that one of the JCs was not upholding this policy?

#### Section B: (for applicants who have not served as Junior Counselors)

- 1. What do you expect this new role to be like?
- 2. Please describe how you would handle two of the following scenarios:
  - a. One of the campers in your cabin just called another camper a name. What would you do?
  - b. One of the campers in your cabin has been homesick since the beginning of camp. Camp has now been going on for 5 days and the camper still cries every night. How would you deal with this situation?
  - c. You've spent the last week working very hard as a JC and you're feeling very tired. It's rest period and one of the more needy campers in your cabin is asking for your help with something. You have very little patience at the moment. What would you do?
  - d. During your night on cabin duty, one of the campers tells you that he or she has an eating disorder. How would you handle this situation?

#### Section C: (for applicants who have served as Junior Counselors)

- 1. What were some of the challenges you faced as a Junior Counselor? How do you feel more prepared to face those challenges this summer?
- 2. What did you learn and how did you grow as a result of being a Junior Counselor?
- 3. Coming into the role of a Junior Counselor for a second year, you have the benefit of experience behind you. Given your experience, what do you plan to bring to the job this summer? How will you do things differently? What will you continue to do in the same way?
- 4. Please explain one situation you encountered and handled last year that related to one of the following topics:
  - a. Caring for campers in need of support.
  - b. Conflicts and resolutions with other Junior Counselors or Counselors.
  - c. Teaching and leading others.
  - d. Fatigue or stress.
- 5. Why are you interested in returning to be a JC again this summer and what strengths will you bring to the program?
