

Paleo Experiment Equipment List 2021

PURPOSE

Packing for your Added Adventure should be done with care to ensure you have all of the necessary clothing and equipment for a safe and fun trip. Each item on this list has been carefully selected and is required.

**You will find some of these items are already on the Camp packing list; we are emphasizing their importance here. There is no need to bring duplicates or pack separately. **

CLOTHING CONSIDERATIONS

On your Added Adventure, you will layer clothing for warmth and protection from the elements. You will use synthetic fibers, such as polyester, fleece, and wool, which keep you warm when wet. You should **avoid cotton**, which is poor insulation when wet.

Layers: Our clothing list is based on the following layering principals; the 4 W's.

Base Layer: Wicking – this layer wicks sweat and moisture away from your skin, keeping you from getting too cold. This will be your synthetic top and bottom layers and long underwear.

Light/Mid Weight Layer: Warmth – This will be your fleece jacket/bottom layers. These layers create a space for warm air to be trapped, keeping you warm.

Insulating Layer: More Warmth – For those of us who get cold easily... same as above. This layer adds to the insulation keeping us warmer. This is an optional layer for this trip!

Outer Layer: Weather – This is the outermost layer and will protect us against wind, rain, and cold. Make sure this layer is breathable and 100% waterproof.

Hiking Boots			1	Medium-weight, over the ankle boots – Break them in before arrito to prevent blisters! (Recommend: Asolo, Vasque, Merrell)
Camp Shoes			1	A comfortable shoe you don't mind getting dirty. You'll want the after a long day on the trail. (<i>Recommend: Old tennis shoes, crocs, similar.</i>)
Hiking Socks			3-4	Non-Cotton, hiking socks. We will use these for our backpacking section. (Recommend: Smartwool, darn tough, REI, or similar. Log for "merino wool".)

				Synthetic, light to medium weight long underwear set. (<i>Recommend:</i>			
Long Underwear Top and Bottom			1	REI, Patagonia, Smart Wool, or similar) Long underwear helps to keep us warm and dry!			
Synthetic T-Shirts			3-4	Synthetic, non-cotton t-shirts. (<i>Recommend: REI, Patagonia, or similar</i>)			
Athletic Shorts			3-4	Synthetic, non-cotton shorts. (<i>Recommend: REI, Patagonia Baggies, Nike runners, or similar</i>).			
Lightweight Top			1	Synthetic, non-cotton. This can be a long-sleeved quick dry shirt, lightweight fleece pullover, sweater, or full zip jacket. (<i>Think: Light jacket or long sleeved layer</i>)			
Long Hiking Pants			1	Synthetic, non-cotton hiking pants. It can get pretty buggy out there and you'll find yourself wanting to hike in these! REI has a great variety of selection of these.			
Fleece Jacket			1	Synthetic, non-cotton. This needs to be heavier than the lightweight top. (Recommendation: REI Groundbreaker, Patagonia Synchilla or Similar)			
Fleece Pants			1	*Optional Synthetic, non-cotton fleece pants. These are magical. (Recommendation: Hot Chillys, Patagonia) Note: If you get cold easily, you'll want to have these on hand. I personally can vouch for the Hot Chillys brand and wear my fleece pants whenever it gets remotely cold.			
Insulating Jacket			1	Synthetic or down insulation, non-cotton. Think: puffy jacket or windbreaker. (Recommendation: REI Revelcloud, REI Flash Jacket, Patagonia Nano Puff or Similar.)			
Rain Jacket W/ Hood			1	Must be 100% waterproof! (Recommendation: REI Rainier, Marmot precip or Patagonia Torrentshell)			
Rain Pants			1	100% Waterproof and large enough to fit over your hiking pants and long underwear. (Recommend: REI, Marmot)			
Warm Hat			1	Wool or Fleece.
